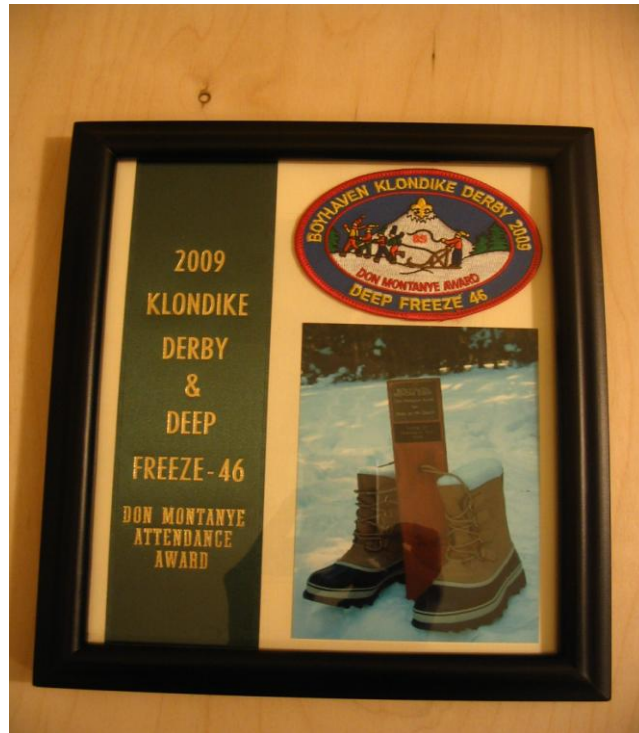


# Don Montanye Award



The "Don Montanye Award" was first awarded at the 2008 Klondike Derby & Deep Freeze at Camp Boyhaven. At the Sunday Closing Ceremony, special event patches and a ribbon are presented to the Scoutmaster of the Troop that registered the largest number of Scouts and adult leaders Saturday morning.

Don was a member of the event staff for many years serving in a number of capacities - patrol flag judge, sledge judge, starter, registrar, attendance record-keeper, and more. He is one of a band of "renegade" Scouters who have worked to keep this event alive for going on 50 years... a "MOTWOM".

This award joins the "Chuck Moehle Award" for the best Derby Sledge, the "Glen Grant Award" for the best Derby Patrol Flag, the "Thomas B. Chaisson Award" for a successful clothing check at the Starting Line and the "Ted Brown 'Ace Patrol' Award" for the patrol earning the highest score in the Klondike Derby.

Chuck, Glen and Tom have "gone home"; Ted is still going strong at 90+ years young. Today's Klondike Derby and Deep Freeze leaders keep the tradition alive in honor of these extraordinary men.
