Winter hiking and camping are favorite sports among the Boy Scout Troops of Schenectady County due in very large part to the decades of leadership and training that Ted has provided to young men and their adult leaders. He and his OKPIK Winter Camping & Survival Training team have taught hundreds of adult leaders and senior scouts to camp and hike safely in the wintertime even at sub-zero temperatures. Ted was one of the early leaders and designers of the annual Klondike Derby & Deep Freeze at Camp Boyhaven, an event that will celebrate its 45th continuous year of operation in January of 2008. In the early 1990's he created an "Outdoor Leadership Training"

course to teach Scout leaders how to plan trips for their Troops in the hope that they, in turn, would pass these important skills along to their youth leaders. A frequent lecturer at Boy Scout meetings and advisor to dozens of boys working on their Camping Merit Badge, Ted continues to preach the simple formula for wintertime outdoor survival: "Keep warm, dry, and well-fed".
